The Williamsburg City Council met in regular session on April 13, 2009 at 6:00 p.m. at the Williamsburg Civic Center.

Mayor Roddy Harrison declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

I. Approval of the March 9, 2009 Regular Council Meeting Minutes

III. Report on City Hall by Codell Construction

Mr. Doug Smith, Codell Construction's site manager stated that everything is on schedule and on Budget. Mr. Smith told council that painting should begin this week and the plumbing work is completed except for setting and installing fixtures and connecting to the main sewer line. Mr. Smith stated that the last thing would be installing storm drains, grading and paving the parking lot and installing carpet and tile. He told the cornice isn't up yet and it will take about six weeks for it to come in, which it is specially made for the building. He stated it shouldn't prevent them from being able to move into the New City Hall.

IV. Council Comments

Mayor Harrison informed the council that there are currently eight new benches being installed along Main Street, in addition to 10 new garbage cans and a dozen of three-foot long, three-tier flower pots.

Kentucky utilities will be taking down the old street lights this week along with the old phone lines. Mayor stated that after the lights are taken down, he hopes they will start on the new lights on 25 W.

Mayor Harrison told council that the recent PRIDE clean-up day had over 1, 200 volunteers. Over 900 bags of trash were collected in addition to 80 tires and the remains of a meth lab. In all volunteers worked over 3, 300 hours.
