

**City of Williamsburg
Regular Council Meeting Minutes
August 14, 2017

The Williamsburg City Council met in regular session on July 10, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. in the Williamsburg City Hall.

Mayor Harrison declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

I. Approval of August 14, 2017 Regular Council Meeting Minutes

A motion by Councilmember Faulkner and seconded by Councilmember Harris to approve the August 14, 2017 Regular Council meeting minutes.

II. Floor Business

Mayor Harrison asked council to allow him to check into the financing for \$250,000.00 for a project that will upgrade fire hydrants and water lines. It would include replacements of older fire hydrants, some water valves throughout town, replacement of some water lines and possibly some drainage work. He stated the city really needs to get some valves where they can turn the water off without having to let the tanks run out in order to fix some of the problems.

Mayor stated the city has been trying to find grant money to do some of these projects for about year.

Mayor Harrison said it would cost the city about \$20,000 annually to finance such project for 20 years, and about \$30,000 to finance it for 10 years. He said he would prefer a 10 year financing option.

Council asked for the city to prioritize the work done on the projects.

A motion by Councilmember Connell and seconded by Councilmember Stanfill to allow the Mayor to move forward on looking for financing for \$250,000.

All voting aye, motion carried.

Mayor Harrison announced that phase three would soon be started on a project with Precision Concrete to remove "toe Stumps" from city sidewalks that could cause people to fall. This phase of work would include sidewalks along both sides of Main Street from the bridge to 11th Street, and sidewalks around the campus of the University of the Cumberlands. UC is helping with the financing for work on the campus sidewalks. Precision Concrete hopes to start work Thursday, August 17th on the University of the Cumberlands campus so the work can be completed before classes resume.

IV. Adjournment

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Councilmember Harris and seconded by Councilmember Faulkner. All voting aye, motion carried.
