I. Approval of July 12, 2010 Regular Council meeting

III. HDR Quest

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Hamblin to move forward with the smoke testing of the sanitary sewer system consistent with the HDR proposal as presented to council. This activity is part of the agreed order requirements from the Ky Division of Water. All voting aye, motion carried.

A motion by Councilmember Stanfill and seconded by Councilmember Riley to approve the mayor to submit an application to the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority for a Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan to design and construct the Ball Park Pump Station/Force Main Project. All voting aye, motion carried.

IV. First reading of an Ordinance establishing the City of Williamsburg Property Tax Rate for the Year 2010

Mrs. Greta Price, City Attorney read the first reading of an Ordinance establishing the City of Williamsburg Property Tax Rate for the Year 2010.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Williamsburg, Kentucky that the 2010 tax rate for Real Property shall be .2500 cents per \$100 dollar valuation, Personal Property including automobiles shall be .3585 cents per \$100 dollar valuation.

Any city Property taxes unpaid as of January 1, 2011 shall be assessed a penalty of Ten (10) Percent, as well as interest at the rate of six (6) percent until paid. Second Reading will be at the September 13, 2010 Regular Council Meeting

V. Approval of Interlocal Agreement between Whitley County, City of Williamsburg and the City of Corbin, 911 NCIC Agreement

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Hamblin to approve an Interlocal Agreement between Whitley County, City of Williamsburg and the City of Corbin for the purpose of establishing management control of the Whitley County 911 Dispatch Center, the information obtained through the Law Information Network of Kentucky (LINK), the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS). All voting aye, motion carried.

-would like to see a welcome sign "Home of Kentucky splash Water Park." Main Street Manager, Nannie Hays, stated that the Whitley County Extension Office is trying to get a grant for a welcome sign. Councilmember West also stated that it would be nice to have a sign along with the "Home of Roy M. Chappell, Tuskegee Airman" a sign saying "Home of Patricia Neal."

Councilmember Foley

- -heard that the PSC is raising the Electric rates and it could be a substantial increase -stated that the railroad crossing in town is rough going across and needs to be repaired
- -stated that the state has repaired the bump on at the interstate bridge -stated people are not taking down yard sale signs.

Councilmember Riley

-stated that the Hurricane Hollow Road in front of Long John Silver's need to be patched

Councilmember Harris

- -stated she had a list of sidewalks that needed to be replaced
- -asked about the two burnt houses on 10th Street
