VII. Council Comments

Mayor Harrison

-gave an update concerning work on Exit 11 interchange. Mayor told council that work is expected to be done by mid-March in order to get traffic flow back to its original pattern. The final design work is expected to be done by late spring or early summer.

-discussed the construction status of the New City Hall. Mayor stated that it should be under roof soon. The trusses are expected to be set this week.

-discussed a wish list of projects that could be ready within four to five months, if funding can be found. President Barack Obama has said he would like to spend part of the economic stimulus money on government projects. Mayor stated that two of the projects were the \$3.2 million phase three renovation at the water plant and \$1.1 million to renovate 10th Street to raise the bridge out of the flood plain and widen the road.

Council member Hamblin

- asked of the maintenance department had purchased new cones
- stated a guardrail is in need on Brush Arbor. Mayor told council that the city has the guardrail and will be putting it up.
- stated that a “Authorized Personnel Only” sign needed to be at the Transfer Station
- stated that the sidewalk on Main Street at the college looks very nice

Council member Harris

- stated that there is a problem with blighted property on Rice Street. Something needs to be done with the junk cars parked at 279 Rice Street and Johnson Avenue. Mayor stated that if the city’s newest blighted property ordinance doesn’t fix the problem; the city might create a code enforcement board.

Council member West

- stated that she had a complaint on the resident of 310 North 10th Street working on cars late at night
- asked the progress on the new water slide at the Water Park. Mayor stated that it would be up and running this season and that they are looking for a name for the slide.
- asked if the city could get a flashing light at the school crossing

Council member Foley

- asked if Julia Lane could be blacktopped
- concerned with the blighted property on North 2nd and North 2rd Street
- stated that the trash on the floodwall could be cleaned up
- stated that the sirens are working well with the automatic system that goes off

Council member Riley

- stated that the garbage bin needs to be cleaned up at Butch’s
- stated that outside the sanitation garage needs to be cleaned up
- stated that the business on 25W in front of Kenneth Shaw residents is looking band and need to be cleaned up
- asked if the city was going to hire a Recreation Director
