The Williamsburg City Council met in Regular Session January 13, 2011, at 6:00 p.m. at the Williamsburg City Hall.

**Roddy Harrison, Mayor declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.**

**I. Approval of November 10, 2010 Regular Council Meeting Minutes**

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Riley to approve the November 10, 2010 Regular Council Meeting Minutes. All voting aye, motion carried.

**II. Floor Business**

Mayor Harrison introduced Mr. Bryan Mills, Eastern KY Field Representative for Mr. Rand Paul.

Mr. Greg Partin, Kentucky League of Cities presented council with information on the League of Cities Safety Grant and thanked council for being part of the Kentucky league of Cities.

Adam Sulfridge presented a certificate of appreciation to members of the Williamsburg Fire Department for their efforts during the city's annual Christmas parade.

Wayne Bird, Police Chief said that his department responded to 7,059 total calls in 2010, made 950 arrests, issued 689 traffic citations and opened 348 criminal investigations.

James Privett reported that the firefighters responded to 145 total incidents in 2010, including: 37 fires, and 33 rescue and emergency medical services assist calls. Mr. Privett noted that each full-time firefighter is required to have 100 training hours per year and that each volunteer firefighter is required to have 20 training hours per year.

### **III. Second Reading of Pawn Shop Ordinance**

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Stanfill to approve the second reading of the Pawn shop Ordinance. All voting aye, motion carried.

### **IV. Request for Street Lights**

Motion by Councilmember Riley and seconded by Councilmember West to approve the request for street lights on Briar Creek Road, two on South second Street and on 25W where it crosses from Moore Street to Cemetery Road. All voting Aye, motion carried.
