The Williamsburg City Council met in Regular session on May 13, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. at the Williamsburg City Hall.

Mayor Harrison declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

I. Approval of April 8, 2013 Regular Council Meeting Minutes

A Motion by Councilmember Harris and seconded by Councilmember Sharp to approve the April 8, 2013 regular council meeting minutes. All voting aye, motion carried.

II. Floor Business

Janice Bengé an employee and the city's Safety Coordinator wrote a grant through the Kentucky League of Cities for safety equipment for the City of Williamsburg.

Mr. Greg Partin, KLC Safety Coordinator presented a safety grant check to the City in the amount of \$1,304.51.

III. 911 Interlocal Agreement

A motion by Councilmember West and seconded by Harris to approve Resolution No# 2013-09, 911 Interlocal Agreement between the Whitley County, the City of Williamsburg and the City of Corbin, for the purpose of establishing management control of the Whitley County 911 Dispatch Center, located in Williamsburg, Whitley County, Kentucky, and thereby, the information obtained through the Law Information Network of Kentucky (LINK), the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), and the National Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS).

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Stanfill to approve the 911 Interlocal Agreement. All voting aye, motion carried.

IV. Sell of Lion Uniform

Mayor Harrison asked for the city council to vote on selling the old Lion Uniform Building to American Pet Food Manufacturing Corporation for One Dollar. The building was donated to the City of Williamsburg. Mayor Harrison stated no provisions were made for the building to revert back to the city. Attempts were made to put in provisions but those attempts were unsuccessful because the buildings new owner plans to use the property to secure funding to expand her business. The provisions wouldn't be possible unless the city also agreed to assume responsibility for the planned debt.

A motion by Councilmember Foley and seconded by Councilmember Harris to approve the sale of the Lion Uniform Building for one dollar. All voting aye motion carried.

V. Municipal Aid Cooperative Contract/Resolution for Fiscal Year 2013-2014

A motion by Councilmember Sharp and seconded by Councilmember Foley to approve the Municipal Road Aid Coop Program Contract for the Fiscal Year 2013-2014. All voting aye, motion carried.

VI. Second reading of an Ordinance establishing Zoning Changes for the City of Williamsburg

Mrs. Greta Price read the second reading of an Ordinance # 13-005 establishing eight zoning changes, which were recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

A motion by Councilmember West and seconded by Councilmember Foley to approve Ordinance #13-005 establishing eight zoning changes, which were recommended by the planning and Zoning Commission. All voting aye motion carried.

VII. Adjournment

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Councilmember Stanfill and seconded by Councilmember Harris. All voting aye, motion carried.
