**The Williamsburg City Council met in Regular Session October 10, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. at the Williamsburg City Hall.**

**Mayor Harrison declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.**

**I. Approval of August 8, 2011 Regular Council Meeting Minutes**

A motion by Councilmember Riley and seconded by Councilmember Stanfill to approve the August 8, 2011 Regular Council Meeting Minutes. All voting aye, motion carried.

**II. Floor Business**

Mr. Richard Smith, HDR Quest Engineers came before council to discuss the status repair to the city's sewer and wastewater treatment system in response to an agreed order with the Kentucky Division of Water. He stated part of the necessary repairs are going to involve digging up portions of Main Street over the coming week and months to fix leaking repairs.

Mr. Smith said that the Briar Creek Pump station project is being split into two phases largely for financial reasons. The first phase of the project would increase pumping capacity to 1, 100 gallons per minute and eventually increase to 2, 500 gallons per minute. The second phase of the project will cost \$1.6 million and involves changing the force main.

**III. First reading of an Ordinance establishing the City of Williamsburg Property Tax Rate for the year 2011.**

Mrs. Greta Price, City Attorney read the first reading of an Ordinance establishing the City of Williamsburg Property Tax Rate for the Year 2011.

The rate on real property will be .2600 cents per \$100 dollar valuation, Personal Property including automobiles will be .3586 cents per \$100 dollar valuation. Any city taxes unpaid as of January 1, 2012 shall be assessed a penalty of Ten (10) percent as well as interest at a rate of six (6) percent until paid.

Second reading of the Tax Ordinance will be Thursday, October 13, at 4:00 p.m.

**IV. Fall Clean-up, October 17<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> Highland Park and October 24<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> Downtown.**
